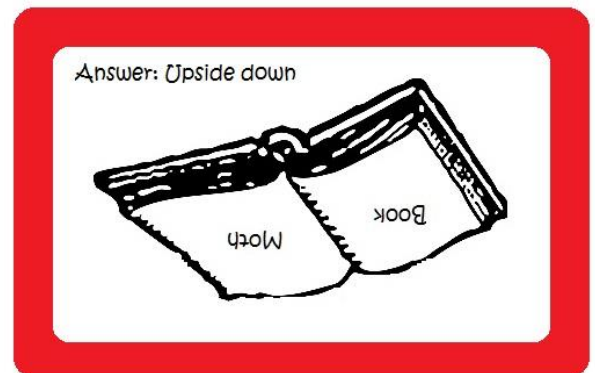

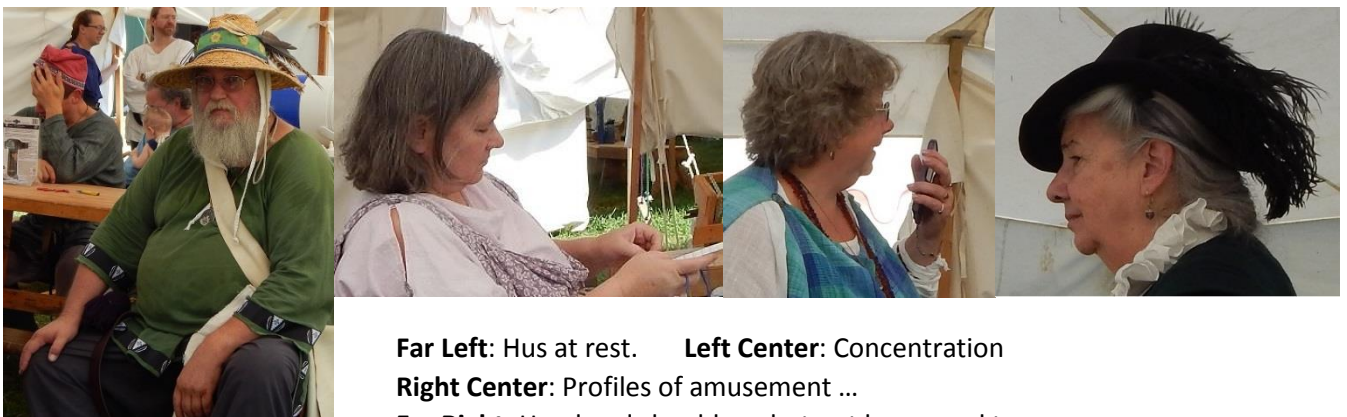

For good, readable, very current scholarship on the subject, I refer you to:

Bradbury, Jim. *The Medieval Archer*. New York: St. Martin's Press, 1985. 198pp.

Bradbury shoots a lot of arrows into the myth of the long bow as a Welsh invention, making it quite clear that it was English in origin. He also gives dimensions for some arrows which put them close in dimensions to golf-tube arrows (not *really* close: 86cm long, 2.54cm thick).

And:

Davis, R.H.C. *The Medieval Warhorse*. New York: Thames and Hudson, 1989. 144pp.

Davis addresses horse breeding and breeds in England, as well as horse prices, in addition to discussing their deployment in battle and in the tournament and tilts.

Neither of these books is especially thick or especially dense.

Driving Directions:

Archery Practice: Beaver Creek Conservation Area: No Crossbows. No Archery in freezing temperatures (32° F). From Rolla, take Highway 63 south for several miles. The range gate will be on your left, immediately across the highway from the VFW post. Drive through the gate to the top of the hill, park and take the line!

Fighter Practice: Go South from the 163 exit of I-44. Turn left (East) on the frontage road (Z highway) towards Devil's Elbow. Approx 1/10 of a mile (shortly past Sweetwater BBQ) turn right onto Tapestry Ln into Wyndridge Estates. Follow the road, 3rd house on the left with the long, black box trailer in the driveway. Hope to see you there!

Shire Meetings: Newburg United Methodist Church: Take I-44 to the Newburg Exit. Turn south. The church will be on your right, a little past the patrol car waiting at the bottom of the hill to catch all of you scoff-law speeders.
